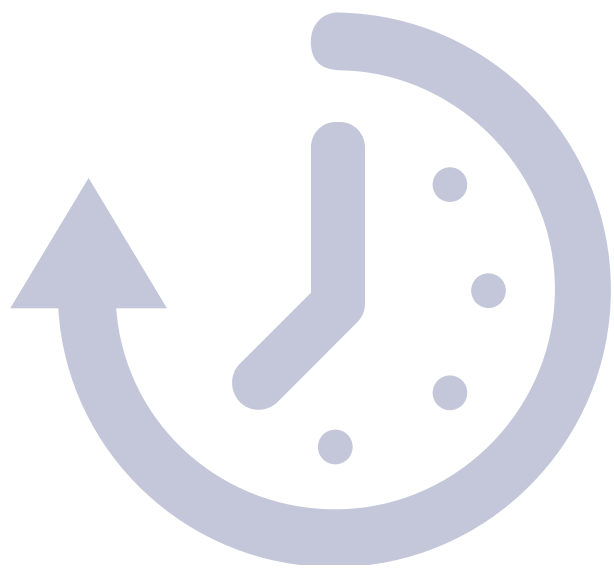

- Productive activities
- Personal activities
- Simultaneous/Parallel activities
- Primary activity
- Secondary activity
- Activity classification

Type of surveys

- Dedicated /standalone survey
 - Fully independent
 - Sample linked to another
- Incorporated in another survey
 - Module
 - Section fully integrated

- Background information {
- Household questionnaire
 - Individual questionnaire
